The July Session meeting was at the home of the Ross-Westons. A motion was passed to support a limited elder care program sponsored by the Vashon Senior Center. VPC has agreed to supply a space for qualified outside staff to provide elder care for a few seniors a few hours, two days a week. The point of this program is to offer a brief respite to their full-time caregivers. No additional costs are anticipated, and the project is still in the planning stages.

Most of our time together was devoted to considering the following question: What would be the communitywide reaction if the Vashon Presbyterian Church closed its doors?

Our community would:

- Not have the inspirational sayings on our reader board
- Realize how much space we provide for non-profits
- Not have a place to meet for various community-wide programs
- Feel the loss of our impact on the rest of the small churches on the island
- Not have a place for IFCH to host meals
- Not have the AA support we have provided the space for over 40 years

- Lose our hosting two schools
- Lose the prime location for the activities we host
- Miss the lighting of the big tree in front of our church for Christmas
- Lose the energy lift we provide to the community
- Lose the positive impact in our local community
- Lose the enthusiasm we have for our missions, support for island wide ministries
- Miss the character our church represents
- Be diminished

In other words, we provide a vital service to our Vashon Community! While we are always seeking new ways to support our church and our island, let's take a moment to reflect and celebrate the many ways VPC (meaning you!) makes a positive difference in our community.

Scholarships, Outreach to the Public, IFCH, Mission Partner Relations

The Festival parking and seats was a success! We had over 100 seat and 40 parking reservations. More than \$1,300 was donated and is being forwarded to Vashon's Journeymen Institute. The organization's web page states "Journeymen Institute is a 501(c)3 non-profit organization based on Vashon Island, WA. In addition to our signature nature-based rites of passages for boys in Puget Sound, integration support, and mentoring, we host various workshops and training courses designed to empower youth and the adults in their lives to catalyze positive change in our rapidly changing world." Thanks to the volunteers who helped with this annual project.

August 4 is Food Bank Sunday. Please remember that food insecurity is not taking a vacation, and non-perishable food and personal hygiene supplies are always needed. Please bring items to the worship service or church office. The Food Bank also notes that "perishable foods can be donated directly to staff. Please do not leave perishable foods in the shed or left outside. If you are a farm or gardener with an overflow of produce to donate, contact harvest@vashonfoodbank.org to coordinate."

First Friday is August 2, and we will have snacks and games on the front lawn that evening. The Cub Scouts will have a space to set up a table to advertise their program for the coming year.

Building and Grounds

Recent projects

With the departure of our toddlers' group, which met weekly on Tuesdays, the nursery needed new paint, and the Great Hall paint needed touching up. Trace Hyde has been working on that project.

Our parking lot resurfacing has been completed.

Both back porches are in the process of being overhauled by Vashon Custom Homes. The contractor is awaiting new doors and frames to replace the weather-damaged existing doors and frames and plans for a dumbwaiter.

Future maintenance required

The stairs from the nursery to the courtyard need replacing. We will work with Cooperative Preschool, who had agreed to split the cost.

The carpets in the Social Hall, Great Hall, Church Office, East Room, Narthex, and West Entry Hall will be cleaned on Wednesday, August 14.

Cintas will perform quarterly testing of the sprinkler system on August 20.. This test is recommended by the National Fire Protection Agency.

King County Surface Water Management requires VPC to self-inspect and repair our storm water drainage system before November. Since August is the driest month of the year, we will need to open all catch basins in the parking lot and both settling ponds, inspect them, remove excess silt intrusion and make any necessary repairs.

Baseboard trim in the kitchen, beneath the center island, still needs to be purchased and installed.

Additional electrical outlets still need to be installed in the Sanctuary.

We need to sand and stain the front door, the library table, and the Communion table.

The wooden fence separating VPC's front lawn from Zamorano's dining area needs to be replaced.

Our Building Serves our Community

IFCH dinners are served Monday through Friday from 5:00 – 6:00. Preparation starts at 4:00.

The Opera Company will hold rehearsals in the sanctuary Thursday evenings throughout August, and on Tuesday, August 27. All rehearsals are from 6:30-8:30.

From September 10 -December 3, the Vashon Chorale will hold rehearsals in the Sanctuary on Tuesday evenings from 7:00-9:00.

The Healthcare District continues holding meetings in the Social Hall on the first, third, and fourth Wednesdays of the month from 6:30 – 7:30.

Building and Grounds (Continued)

From the Planning Committee:

After taking a month breather, the Planning Committee met on July 30. We reviewed the work we have to do and made suggestions for what areas we need to address.

One project not yet finished is the replacement for the carpet removed next to the organ in the sanctuary. We are planning to use luxury vinyl planks (LVL) to fill that space, which is a small. The LVL should not take long to install. We will be looking for the planks in August.

We have not forgotten the plan to have training sessions for our AED at the Fire Department. They will probably be scheduled for this Fall on a Thursday night.

A sound technician looked at our system in the Sanctuary. He deemed our current setup to be adequate, and we do not need to make any large outlays for additional equipment. However, we need and will be looking for a small locking cabinet to house our amplifier so that the Techs do not have to lean over and peer into a dark space to make volume adjustments.

Finally, we are still investigating an improved locking system for our doors to help us better control/monitor access to our building. There may be a trial of one system soon.
