A Message from Pastor Leigh



Dear Ones of VPC,

At our September Theology Pub discussion, we shared what being a part of a faith community means to each of us. I was struck by the level of comfort we naturally find together. I heard words like "safe" and "honest" and "real." I also heard a thirst to share our stories of where and how God has been at work in our lives and the lives of our church family.

It had been a hard day for me. My own personal family is struggling with the continuing struggles of my dad and his cancer journey. By the time I got to Theology Pub, I had cried off my make up not once but twice. Years ago, I might have made excuses and gone home early, but safe, honest, and real are what I've also experienced in your midst also. So, I stayed, and I shared, and it made a difference.

We all want to be polished in this life our ours. We all want to look our best and present like we have it all together, but the simple fact is that no one has it together all the time. That is exactly why I believe God created us to be in community and why I think how we take care of our community matters greatly.

VPC is a small but mighty group of folks. We do a lot. People in the community often comment on how much we do. I don't think we should stop doing those things, but I also want you to know that what you DO is far less important than who you are and how you matter.

I hope you feel safe. I hope you can be honest, and I hope you can be real here. God wants us to share our life journey together to stand in witness to those tender moments and draw strength from how others have gotten through their hard days, too.

When Jesus sent the disciples out to share his message and love with others, he sent them out in pairs. He didn't send them out alone. He knew that being a disciple didn't mean life would always be easy or simple. And I suspect he knew that together they could carry the load of life more than either of them could as individuals.

So, my friends, I encourage you to show up. Come to worship, come to Theology Pub, pop onto a Zoom meeting, drop by the office, call one another, call me. Show up for yourselves and for each other. Know that God didn't create you to be alone.

Together, let us all stand in witness to what God might be doing in our midst. I personally know that I experienced the love of God, sitting in a brew pub, surrounded by fellow believers, on a pretty hard day and when I drove home my prayers were of gratitude.

And, as always, I am here for you and with you.

Community Service Areas of Responsibility

Scholarships, Outreach to the Public, IFCH, Mission Partner Relations

October 6 is Food Bank Sunday. Non-perishable food such as pasta, peanut butter and tuna and personal hygiene supplies are always needed. With colder weather here, canned meals to heat up, such as beef stew or chili, are also appreciated. Please bring items to the worship service or church office. Last year 1,707 individuals relied on the Food Bank because of food insecurity. We can help these people with our donations!

Thanks to all who made Motorcycle Sunday a success. Donations from our friends who enjoyed coffee and pastries amounted to \$481. Session voted to contribute those receipts to the Vashon Community Scholarship Foundation to be used for VPC's 2025 scholarship award.

Upon recommendation from the Community Service committee, the Planning Committee agreed to transfer \$10,000 from the funds received from Kate Smith's estate to the Heindsmann Endowment fund principal. Kate was very interested in education, and we believe this is an appropriate way to use part of that bequest. The increased fund principal will produce increased annual earnings; that will allow us to award a larger scholarship that reflects the continuing higher cost of tuition.

Building and Grounds

Work is underway to put track lighting in the Belfry. We currently have no overhead lighting up there.

The solar panels have been cleaned so that our solar energy will be optimal.

In searching for more storage places within the building, we discovered a large area of empty space adjacent to the Youth Room. We also discovered a lonely wooden chair trapped in that space. We have since rescued that chair, which is currently in Leigh's office. We'll find a special place for it soon. We will construct a new closet within the empty space.

Our Second Saturday work party will be on October 12, from 10:00 AM – noon. This will involve fall outdoor clean up and installation of the vinyl plank flooring just to the left of the organ in the Sanctuary. Please plan to be at this work party, even if you can't stay the whole time.

From the Planning Committee

The VPC Planning Committee met in early September to make plans for the Fall months.

It was agreed that we would purchase laminated veneer lumber (LVL) to cover the small area by the organ that no longer has carpeting. The material was purchased and will be installed in October.

We are still working on plans to have the fire department present some classes on AED use. We have been unable to set a firm date but hopefully classes will happen in the next couple of months.

The Community Service Committee, chaired by Elder Bob Spangler, suggested that recommended to the Planning Committee that we transfer \$10,000 from the Smith Fund to the Heindsmann Fund to help to increase the annual scholarship funds the church has available. This was unanimously agreed.

Our final item addressed was the replacement of the locking system used at the church. We have many, many keys loaned out and some are unaccounted for. We hope to replace what we currently have by a keyless locking system. Stay tuned for further updates.

Elizabeth Loveness is looking into a lockable cabinet for our sound amplifier. It is current set low in the existing cabinet and is awkward and difficult to adjust during services.

The front door badly needs refinishing. That may happen sometime soon.

The fence along our border with Zamorana's needs replacing. Plans are underway.

There are several non-working light bulbs our in our parking lot bank of lights that will be replaced once we find someone with a lift truck that can perform this task.
