approach giving with joy. November 13th and 20th have been designated by the Worship Committee as the two Sundays we will explore giving not only our money, but our whole selves to God's service.



PNC Update

October 17, 2016

This was our first organizational meeting. We received the paperwork to complete as part of the search process. We were advised to read through all forms and bring questions to the next meeting. The documents reviewed were the Ministry Information Form (MIF), the Instructions for the form, and two documents from the Committee on Ministry (COM). In order to prepare ourselves for the search and our ability to represent our congregation we decided to review the following summaries from surveys and discussions that have taken place at VPC over the last year. These included: Ouestions and Answers to the Session from June 15: Roles in the PNC Process: a document submitted to session by the Interim Pastor on the current use of pastor time, major learnings, and recommendations for consideration when calling a part-time pastor; and the Mission Statement and Narrative adopted by VPC this past summer.

Larry Commerce was elected to be chair of the committee and Diana Lilje volunteered to be scribe. The next meetings were set for Tuesday, Nov 1 and Monday, Nov 7. Both will be at 7 pm.

Exterior painting of the church is still underway although we're experiencing some delays due to rain and siding repairs. The students and teachers of Carpe Diem and Creative Preschool are to be commended for putting up with a couple of very noisy days during the siding repair. Please pray for the return of dry weather. When the weather allows, the painting could be finished in a couple of weeks. Our Toolbelts group (which meets Tuesdays from 10-2) are now sanding and prepping the railing around the ramp to the north entrance. We will paint that railing when weather allows as the amount of hand painting required would have added considerably to the paint contractor's cost.

Carpe Diem and Creative Preschool classes have resumed with no major problems. We met before school started to discuss our agreement with Carpe Diem's new Head of School, Mark McGough, and he was very amenable to our concerns and suggestions. We will continue to meet on a monthly basis for "checking-in". I hope you were able to attend their "Afternoon of the Poets" on Halloween. Last year it was a wonderful event and opportunity to interact with these young scholars and their families. We left the church open (with volunteer chaperones) during the town's Trick-or-Treat activities to provide a rest stop for kids and parents. We also look forward to sharing activities with these adorable preschoolers during the holidays.

<u>Speaking of holidays!</u> Session approved a request from the Vashon Chamber of Commerce to use the **large fir tree in front of VPC as this year's**Christmas Tree. Clerk's Corner

Session held its monthly meeting on October 12, with one member absent. Session voted to accept an offer from OMAX Corp. to repurchase 1,200 shares of stock, at \$7.60 per share (leaving VPC) owning 7,300 shares). Session considered, but denied, a request for use of the building by a religious study group because the group's theology was inconsistent with our reformed tradition, and confusion as to VPC's message might ensue. Several matters were discussed, but without formal action, including a winter leadership retreat, individual prayer assistance during communion and stewardship planning for November. A request by Carpe Diem for use of the sanctuary for two events this year was approved, as was the suggestion that the building be open on Halloween for the public to use restrooms or as a break from the town events. Two Christmas events were approved: the Mary's Place gift tree and the Vashon Chamber of Commerce request to decorate our tree (subject to payment of the electricity costs). Finally, session appointed three members to review the proposed salary and benefits package for a permanent pastor, and to report back to session for its approval.

A special session meeting was held on October 30 to approve a six month extension of Pastor Lynn's contract as interim pastor.



What's on your mind?

Summary of the first Discovery Dialogue

Discovery Dialogues October 16, 2016.

We had our first monthly Discovery Dialogue after worship Oct 16th. A dozen members met in the library for about an hour after coffee to discuss Carey Nieuwhof's article, **10 predictions about the future Church and shifting attendance patterns**, published in Christian Week magazine on January 25, 2016. If you're reading this electronically you can find that article in an email sent Oct 11th to all recipients of the newsletter.

There were many ideas expressed. Some of the highlights were that Vashon is loaded with indifferent to church but religious people. As the author noted, "people who are churchless (having no church affiliation) will soon eclipse the churched. In addition, 48% of Millennials (born between 1984-2002) can be called post-Christian in their beliefs, thinking and worldview." We wondered how to get an outsider's perception of VPC in a nonjudgmental way in order to improve our interaction. We discussed the value of interacting more with groups that use our facility all week long and connecting with the "churchless" of the community through our participation in and support of outside organizations rather than trying to draw people in.

A lot of discussion centered around the author's prediction that "Churches that love their model more than their mission will die." In a thread that "the future will not be the past" someone pointed out that VPC needs to express our grief and talk about our losses in order to move on. Another member, who couldn't attend but responded to the article wondered, "are we scaring people away by making them feel guilty for not participating?"

I'm very grateful to all who participated in this discussion and hope more people will join us for our next dialogue November 20th. The article to be discussed will be forwarded by email Nov 15th so that you can gather your thoughts before the discussion. Please call the office to receive a copy if you are not on our email list.
