Companionship Workshop Coming to Vashon

What is companionship? It is providing a compassionate presence for people living in circumstances of homelessness, mental illness, addictions, trauma, and isolation. It is rooted in our natural capacities to act on our concern for another person; it is a relational response to isolation and suffering, supportive of healing and recovery. It's not about "fixing" but instead, welcomes the stranger, building a circle of care with persons who are facing emotional and mental health challenges. Companionship aims to share the journey side-by-side with those experiencing distress, bearing witness to the full dignity and story of the persons experiencing these things.

The five practices of companionship are: hospitality, neighboring, side-by-side, listening and accompaniment. The three-hour workshop will explain in detail these practices. Companionship is designed to help individuals gain in knowledge and skill to move with confidence beyond the serving counter and into honest relationships with people in need.

Kae Eaton, who lives on Vashon and works with the Mental Health Chaplaincy will be conducting the workshop. Kae holds a Masters in Theology with emphasis in Counseling Psychology, and a Certificate in Spiritual Direction from the Seattle School of Theology and Psychology. She was the 2018 Chaplain Fellow at the Center of Excellence in Substance Abuse Treatment and Education (CESATE), at the Veterans Administration, Puget sound Healthcare System, and 2017 Chaplain Resident on the Acute Psychiatric Care Unit at the VA Hospital

She also serves as Consultant and Master Trainer for Pathways to Promise, a national cooperative of mental health organizations and faith groups working with those with mental and emotional illnesses and their families. Kae has years of experience on the streets of Seattle, not only working directly with people living without home and dealing with mental health issues, but also training others in the Practices of Companionship through outreach ministries of hospitality. Kae's work and trainings support both secular and faith-based communities locally and nationally.

The workshop will be free of charge, thanks to the Mental Health Advocates at the Vashon Presbyterian Church. The workshop will run from **9am to noon on Saturday, January 11th**. The Mental Health Chaplaincy supports companionship throughout Seattle by providing trainings to churches, nonprofits and other organizations. The goal of the training is to provide the tools to listen consciously, with openness and awareness to the stories and struggles of others, to enable at least a momentary reprieve, and to encourage a strengthening for the journey ahead.

OH MY, IT WAS CERTAINLY A WET DECEMBER! But the **church looked really beautiful once again this Christmas season** thanks to all of us who hung greens and lights, decorated Christmas Trees, moved benches and pews, set up and stowed tables and chairs, rerouted sump pump discharges, mopped and vacuumed up water in the basement and shoveled gravel in the parking lot. Over and over I heard visitors remark about how warmly welcomed they felt at VPC. Like coming home for **the holidays and being warmly embraced!**

Our **new solar panels** have been inspected and approved for operation. We're just waiting now for a PSE electrician to install a "Net Meter" before we join the grid and start getting credit for the solar energy we capture. We are very excited about this major commitment to Creation Care.

While Carpe Diem and Creative Preschool were on Winter break, our toolbelts group joined force with our custodian to **strip and wax the kitchen and back hallway floors.** With 3 coats of sealer and wax on those floors they should maintain their shine through the rest of the school year. Chris Coldeen and I also finished **installing the beautiful sink and vanity** donated by the Commerces in the nursery bathroom.

The Mission Resources Facilities Team meets the first Tuesday of each month at the Colvos Creek Pub from 6 to 7 pm, so please join us Tuesday, January 7th to discuss future needs and activities. Also, feel free to drop in any Tuesday between 10 and noon to help the toolbelts with maintenance and repairs. (At the church that is!)

Financials

I haven't closed out 2019 yet but it obvious that we are going to end the year with a surplus. This would have been the case even without the sale of OMAX stock. Our regular income will exceed the normal expenses by a considerable margin. Thank you all for your generous support of VPC.

The sale of the OMAX stock came as an unexpected windfall and allowed us to do several things that would have been out of our reach otherwise.

- First, we paid off the mortgage. That freed up enough cash flow to bring our Pastor on full time. This has been a long term goal of ours and we were able to accomplish it at least a couple of years early.
- We donated 10% of the OMAX income to some of our mission partners.
- We brought the Capital Repair Fund up to a \$30,000 balance another long term goal.
- Lastly, we were able to install solar panels on the church building. This will radically reduce our electrical bill gojng forward.

I will have a report on fiscal 2019 and the budget for 2020 at the Congregational meeting later this month.
